



VIDEO TIPS

WHAT YOU WILL NEED

Here is a short list of what you will need to film your search:

- smartphone or video camera
- tripod or something to prop the camera up (recommended)
- light
 - If filming indoors, choose areas with lots of natural light and where you can also turn lights on.
- Start line: need 2 cones.
- Boundaries: noted by cones, soccer dots, surveyor flags or painter's tape.

FILMING TIPS

Here are some tips for success for filming your search:

- Hold your smartphone sideways (horizontal) to take a landscape video.
 - Will allow the Online Review Official to see what is going on.
- Ensure there is enough light.
 - Have the sun or brightest light source positioned behind the camera.
 - When working indoors, open the shades and turn the lights on so it is as bright as possible.
- Ensure the Online Review Official can see the entirety of the search area, the hides and the dog and handler team as they are working.
 - There is no need to zoom in while a team is working.
 - Position the camera so zooming is not necessary.
- The Online Review Official must be able to hear or see the handler indicate "Alert" and "Finish."
- Vehicle searches can be challenging to video.
 - The assistant or another person can hold the camera.



VIDEO TIPS

- Moving to film the dog and handler working without being disruptive.

EDITING THE VIDEO

Your video must show both the search setup and the search being conducted within the same video file.

Be certain to show the full, uninterrupted search. No edits or annotations to the video are necessary.

POSTING THE VIDEO

Upload your video to YouTube and copy the SHARE link. This is what you will paste into your entry. Cyber Scent Work does not accept direct uploads of video files.
